This project involves the removal of vegetation from the top surface and walls of the rock cut, scaling the rock cut to remove loose soil, rock, and overburden from behind the crest of the slope, the slope face, benches on the slope, and installing rock anchors to stabilize the rock.

Tenders must be submitted no later than <u>3:00 p.m. January 25, 2017</u>. Late submission will not be considered.
