Metal Detector Permit for metal detecting held on Government public beaches are regulated by the Bermuda National Parks Act 1986, 2009 & 2017 Amendments and the Bermuda National Parks Regulations 1988 & 2018. Permits are issued a minimum of five (5) working days in advance of the activity.

METAL DETECTING TERMS/CONDITIONS

1. All permits are issued at the Department of Parks, located at Global House, 43 Church Street, Hamilton HM12, Bermuda.
2. All Permits expire on the **31st December** of the year they are issued.
3. Permits are valid on public beaches **ONLY**. Metal detecting on dunes, historic sites or other non-beach areas is **PROHIBITED**.
4. The permits must be carried by the applicant at all times when they are metal detecting.
5. Metal detecting is permitted between the hours of sunrise to sunset.
6. During Peak season (April 1st to December 31st) Park Rangers and Lifeguards have the authority to stop metal detecting permit holders at any time they deem necessary.
7. Metal detector permit holders are not allowed to detect amongst beach patrons on any Public beach at anytime.
8. Your consideration of other beach patrons will help to ensure that Bermuda's beaches remain a place of recreation and enjoyment for everyone.
9. Permit holders are only allowed to dig holes in the sand. Holes may be no more than 12inches deep and holes must be filled back in once digging is complete.
10. The permit holder must conform to the appropriate policies and laws set out by the **Police Service, Customs, Immigration and Marine & Ports**
11. Found property of significant value must be delivered to the Department of Parks or a Police Station in order that the rightful owner may be traced.
12. Any historic artifact must be turned in to the Parks Officer or any other authorized officer at the Department of Parks within 24 hours.
13. Failure to comply with the Bermuda National Parks Act 1986, 2009, & 2017 Amendments, and the Bermuda National Park Regulations 1988 & 2018 can and will result in legal action being taken against the permit holder.
